## CONFLICT AND COOPERATION IN THE POST SOVIET SPACE

## Part of CC, PISM, NUPI Project

## Fall semester 2014/15 - Hour: 15-18:15 (four hour session), room 1023 in PKiN

The course is designed for students with an interest in matters relating to the area known as the 'Post-Soviet Space'. The course is team-taught by academics from PISM, CC and NUPI, it is part of a research project funded by the Norwegian / EEA grant scheme. Students will receive expert tuition from a range of lecturers with expertise as academics and think-tankers. In this sense, they will gain valuable insights from quite different perspectives and through contrasting teaching methods and viewpoints. The overall aim is to stimulate students' understanding of the region through an interdisciplinary lens by looking at the politics. economics and security-related dynamics at play in the countries that were once part of the USSR. Particular emphasis is placed upon patterns of conflict and cooperation in the region and the role played by the 'big' actors, including the European Union and Russia. Given the topicality of the subject matter by the end of the course students will have a thorough understanding of the drivers of conflict and cooperation across the region, especially regarding the Ukraine crisis, energy issues, the foreign policies of the EU and Russia and so on.
